- The "Black Day" often observed by National Cadet Corps (NCC) cadets in India refers to February 14th, which marks the anniversary of the 2019 Pulwama terrorist attack. On this date, cadets typically pay tribute to the 40 Central Reserve Police Force (CRPF) personnel who were martyred in the attack in Pulwama, Jammu and Kashmir.

The "Black Day" is not a celebratory event for NCC cadets; rather, it is a day of remembrance and tribute observed on February 14th to honor the martyrs of the 2019 Pulwama terrorist attack.

Activities on Black Day

The observance by NCC cadets typically focuses on solemn activities to honor the sacrifice of the soldiers and to raise national consciousness. Common activities include:

- **Tribute Programs:** Organising special events and assemblies to pay **homage** to the martyrs.
- **Wreath Laying/Homage:** Cadets, along with college faculty and NCC staff, often **submit floral tributes** (Shradhanjali) or light candles in front of a memorial or picture of the martyrs.
- **Speeches and Discussions:** Students deliver **heartfelt speeches** to reflect on the bravery, selflessness, and sacrifice of the soldiers, promoting awareness about the event.
- **Awareness Activities:** Some units may organise activities like decorating notice boards or performing a *Nukkad Natak* (street play) or skits to memorialize the attack and highlight national pride and the valor of the Armed Forces.
- **Pledges:** Taking pledges to uphold the unity and discipline of the nation, reflecting the core values of the NCC.

The observance reinforces the NCC's aim of fostering a spirit of selfless service and motivating youth to serve the nation.
